Is Your Child Late or You Need To Take Them Out Of School Early?

<u>If a child is late for school</u>, please ensure that either your child, or you, sign them in at the front office, otherwise they will remain marked "absent excused". If you know that <u>your child will be away</u>, you need to let the teacher <u>and the office</u> know. If not, the teacher will record their absence as "unexcused", and you will receive an automated phone call from our student absence call out system. If <u>your child must leave early</u>, a parent or guardian needs to sign them out at the front office. Thank you for your cooperation. **AFTER SCHOOL PICK-UP:** Our school day ends at 2:40 pm. It is important to convey after school pick-up arrangements to your child BEFORE the start of their school day. We do not have supervision for students after school.



MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT: Thurs, Sept 26th

We welcome you to come to the school after hours to meet your child's teacher, check out your child's classroom and to tour the school from 6:30 - 7:15 pm. We will meet and make staff introductions in the gym. You can then venture to your child's classroom until 7:15 pm. We will alert parents at 7:00 pm to move to a sibling's classroom (if applicable), and we will say our good byes at 7:15 pm. We encourage further, in-depth conversations with the teachers during our parent-teacher conferences on Oct 23 & 24th (more information to follow).



UPCOMING PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent-teacher conferences are coming up on October 23 & 24th.

At this point, school will have been in session for almost two months and is an opportune time to hear how your child is progressing in his/her first term. <u>The school will be</u> <u>sending you information on how you can sign up on-line</u> for your 15 minute appointment. This way you can choose what time works best for you during the two day period. The appointment start times will be from 12:40 - 5:25 pm on Wednesday Oct 23; and from 12:40 - 2:25 pm on Thursday Oct 24 (with teachers blocking out short time frames for a nutrition break). You will be informed via email on how/when to log on to sign up for your conference times. Note that report cards for term one go home on Dec. 20th.

Orange Shirt Day - Monday Oct.30



Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of <u>Phyllis' story</u> of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually.

The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations.

Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

PARKING LOT CONCERNS

We are becoming <u>increasingly concerned</u> about the congestion in the parking lot closest to the gym. This area is not meant to be a student pick-up or drop-off area, and yet we know the following is happening:

- Students are going through the parking lot to get to their parent's cars when cars are actively moving through the lot.
- Cars are being blocked in by other cars.
- Cars are parking in the fire lane.
- Cars are parking on the grass, etc.

The designated drop-off and pick-up zone is in the "Staff Parking Only" lot where cars can actually drive through. We have a supervisor in place both before and after school to monitor the zone. We do not have a supervisor in the adjacent parking lot, nor should we need one if everyone abided by the procedures. Please <u>do not use the parking lot for dropping off or picking up your child</u>. We suggest you park further down the road and either park and walk your child to school, or allow your child to walk independently. The parking lot is for staff and for parents who are taking their little ones to the preschool in our building. Be respectful that everyone is busy and has places to go, and our ultimate concern is ensuring that our students are safe on the school grounds. Should a car be reported in the fire lane or is blocking another car from leaving, <u>the car will be towed</u>. Thank you for doing your part to keep all of our children safe at Hillcrest.



Family Accident Reimbursement Plan (FARP) through Industrial Alliance

This plan replaces the previous plan that was offered in previous years: Kids Plus Accident Insurance – through IA Financial Group.

This program is once again an alternative for parents to purchase for your students or family if you do not already have extended medical coverage through another plan. This voluntary plan provides coverage for students and their families against accidental injury, unexpected medical expenses and critical illness.
