In lieu of these extra stamp club sessions, the regular Wednesday stamp club meetings are on hold for the time being. All submissions for the show are due to Mrs. Weston by Wednesday Mar. 11. Student work will be displayed at the show on Saturday (10am – 5pm) and Sunday (9:30am-2:30pm). All children present at 2:30 pm on Sunday will participate in a stamp "scramble" after the awards presentation. Your child does not need to attend in order to participate in the show and pages will be returned to the school. Admission to the show is by donation and all funds are returned to the children (prizes, "scramble" items and school stamp club materials).
